- I. In at 30,000, fifteen minutes early on course. Entering target area, bandits seen to right. Col. Jenkins led squadron down for bounce, 77th stayed as top cover. E/A dove down and attacking Sq. climbed back up. In target area flak was on both fighter and bomber level. Smoke pots were being used in target area. P-38 seen diving away to right from formation in this area. Target area clear of cloud. picked up box of bombers and escorted them over target. Swept area for forty minutes leaving target approximately 1200. On way out three (3) Ju 88's (or 188's) sighted below. As group was turning Mejor Montgomery and wingman bounced enemy aircraft. Other two went into clouds. Major Montgomery split S'd and as he drew up on enemy aircraft, E/A split S'd in opposite direction and dove away. No guns fired. Out at approx. 1220 in vicinity of Tonning at 24,000 feet. Weather over channel six to seven tenths at 20,000 feet. Near Frisian Islands cloud cover about 9/10. 10/10 cloud deck at 24,000 over Germany. Target area clear.

Captain Wemyss and 2nd Lt. Frakes flew as spotters patrolling from point 650 miles off English coast to point 150 miles along course. Returning on second leg flight let down to 12,000 feet and found that they were over Dumherque. While flying southwest was fired on by flak over Calais. Got an emergency fix and returned to base.
