- SUBJECT: Summary of Mission to Frankfort. Field Order No. 234, dated 4 February 1944.
- TO: Gormanding General, 67th Fighter Wing, AAF Station F-372, APO 637 U. S. Army.
- 1. This group flew as briefed on course and on time. Shortly after crossing the Dutch coast I nearly aborted the group because of lack of strength. Extremly low temperatures caused twenty-five aircraft to abort with rough engines. However, due to excellent F-47 top cover, it was decided to continue.
- 2. The bombers were escorted through the target area and on the return until the P-47 again took over.
- 3. No enemy activity was observed by this group. Flak was light and inaccurate in the target area.
- 4. The B-24's flew excellent formation and were very easily covered by weaving flights in string above them.
- 5. R/T was good. Fighter bomber intercon was maintained throughout the escort.


