Bombers were B24s of 3rd T. F. and were 12 minutes late so Group made R/V on time but west of scheduled R/V. Stayed with B24s until relieved by 55th Gp. then continued east on sweep of area of 2nd Task Force. Saw B17s ahead in distance but could not identify division. Saw a few P51s in this area and more on the way home. 56th Gp. was with B24s at our R/V. This Group left the B24s at 1202.

Enemy activity: Approximately 10 s. e. E/A were making an attack on a returning straggling bomber just before 20th R/V. Part of the Group turned towards the E/A which immediately gave up the attack and left. The E/A were too far away to to engage. After leaving the B24s one E/A was seen at approximately 35,000 ft. apparently spotting. Another was seen on route out doing the same thing. First one made a pass but when turned into left the area.

P51s and P47s were seen. Lt. Mattyese of 55th Sq. was hit by flak and lost his gas. Was told to head south and then bail out but not to call when he was bailing out.
