BRIEFING NOTES.

P.O. 304

18 April 1944.

Three A.T.F. Comprising the following: 1st A.T.F. 4 C.W's B-17'S  
of 3rd. Division. (Square)  
2nd A.T.F. 5 C.W's B-17's of 1st Div. (triangle)  
3rd. A.T.F. 7 C.W's B-24's 2nd Div. (Circle) (C.W. 39 each instead of 60)

All forces go in to 5253° - 1200° just North of Havelberg where they  
split up if weather is clear and bomb A/C factories and assembly plants at  
Genshagen, Berlin, Brandenburg, Rathenow, and Oranienburg. If they can  
be seen visually, otherwise all will drop their bombs on Berlin.  
(Frederickstrasse ~~XX~~ main line and underground stations)

About 100 S/E & 100 T/E, E A/C can be vectored in our area. Flak is  
very intense. Heavy near Hamburg, Bremen, Hanover, Cuxhaven, Frisian Islands,  
& Heligoland.
