MISSION SUMMARY REPORT 24 APRIL 1944

In North of Knocke at 1232 at 20,000 feet. R/v at Gablingen with lead 2 of 4 boxes of B-24s at 1345 at 20,000 feet. Withdrawal vicinity of Speyer 1434 at 20,000 feet . LF out in two seperate sections one at Gravelines at 1608 at 8,000 feet and other at Ostend at 1600 at 13,000 feet. P-51s in area as we R/V and P-47s relieved us as we Withdrew. One section of eight planes broke for deck at W/D and Captain Reihmer fired on Me-109 on ground on airfeild near Worms. This Me-109 had been previous been fired on and hit in left wing by 55th Squadron pilot. It bellied in and pilot was seen to run away from it. Captain Beihmer saw hits all over plane as he fired and saw it burst into flame. Four airfields seen in general vicinity of Stuttgart-Reutlingen-Ulm-Gunzburg with many T/E aircraft, one field having as many as 75 and others, ten to twenty. Saw two T/E A/C on airfield near Valencienne; three T/E A/C on airfield near Neustadt; four Me-109s, one He-177 and one He-111 on airfield near Worms. Escorted B-17 for five minutes near German-Belgium border with two inboard engines smoking. Saw dummy planes near Bethune airfield. Heavy flak in target area and in Mannheim area, light flak at Gravelines. B-24s scattered but formation within bomes good. Large amount of smoke over target and in Mannheim area, approximately one hundred barrage badoons in Mannehim area.

Some P47s and P51s made simulated attacks on flights of this squadron. One P51 with numbers A9X came in from eight o'clock in such amanner that would have endangered flight if plane had not been friendly.
