After the bombing the 55th Squadron strafed and then P-47s dived bombed or strafed the target. 364th gave penetration support to target area and covered during bombing and for five minutes after. 353rd came in after bombing to attack the field. P-51s were also seen at this time attacking the field.

Damage to MC-A: Inside right engine nacelle 12 foot back of prop damaged by bomb from precending plane that came through prop. Horizontal stabilizer and bottom part of elevator had smaller dents from bomb or bar.
