Friendly (?) Fighters: P51s seen after target and some P47s on way in. Two P38s returning early were bounced by 3 P47s that came out of the sun; firsttwo did not fire but 3rd fired at Lt. Stevens but missed.

Approximately 50 M/Vs seen in Elbe Estuary - stationery. Observed from 30,000 ft. at 1250.
