 - I. In between Schouwen and Overflakkee at 0706 at 22,000 feet. R/V with 2nd Div B-24s over Zuid Beveland at 0711 at 26,000 feet. W/D from rear portion of B-24s at 0755 near Charleville. Covered Laon area while B-17s were in area, bominb observed on several airfields near Laon results fair. Out 0920 near Ostende at 15,000 feet.

At approximately 0730 three Me-109s went down by Blue Flight with one P-38 trailing near Binche. Three P-38s observed spinning- also One Me-109 that looked like he had lost a wing was going down in same area.

P-51s seen along route in and P-47s in Laon area with B-17s.

While escorting B 24s the rear squadron of the group was bounced by 8 Me 109s and 190s. The 79th was ahead and on the right of the bombers and made a 180° to the right. E/A split essed but Blue Leader caught one FW 190 on the tail of a P-38 and followed E/A in a tight climbing turn and destroyed it.

After leaving the B-24s approximately 40 minutes after scheduled W/D, group proceeded on course and picked up B-17s of 1st Task Force and escorted them until vectored by Controller to search for more E/A. P-47s stayed with bombers. 79th went in on a sweep, found nothing and left enemy coast at Ostend.

At 0845 near Lille 2 of our planes were bounced by 2 P-47s with YJ or JY marking and U. S. insignia and marking. One P-47 fired at one of our planes but missed.
