EIGHTH EIGHTER COMD. REGISTRY No. 19503-A COPY No.....

I WAS LEADING THE 79TH FIGHTER SQUADRON FLYING LEAD SHIP IN WHITE FLIGHT. WE WERE SWEEPING THE TARGET AREA AND WE WERE SLIGHTLY SOUTH AND WEST OF THE TARGET AT 22,000 FEET. I SAW 2 FW 190'S BLLOW JUST AS THE GROUP LEADER REPORTED THEM. I PEELED OFF 190'S BLLOW JUST AS THE GROUP LEADER REPORTED THEM. I PEELED OFF WITH MY FLIGHT AND STARTED DOWN KEETING MY BELLY TANKS BECAUSE I WANTED THE GAS IN CASE OF A FIGHT ON THE WAY HOME. I USED 50 INCHES AND 2650 K.P.M. TO GAIN SPEED IN THE DIVE. MY WING MAN WAS F/O BYAD AND HE WAS FOLLOWING ME DOWN. THE 190 WAS IN A GENTLE TURN AS I APPROACHED FROM 45°. IN ORDER TO TULL OUT AND FOLLOW HIM I USED COMBAT FLAP TO HELP COME OUT OF MY DIVE. THE TANK CAME OUT OF THE DIVE VERY NICELY EVEN WITH BELLY TANKS AND AN INDICATED SPEED OF OVER 375. I FOLLOWED THE 190 AND AT ABOUT 350 YARDS AND SPEED OF OVER 375. I FOLLOWED THE 190 AND AT ABOUT 350 YARDS AND AN ANGLE OF 10° I OPENED FILE WITH FOUR 50°S. I WAS CLOSING SLOWLY AND SAW FOUR OR FIVE HITS ON HIS RIGHT WING JUST BEFORE HE WENT INTO THE OVACAST. I PULLED UP AND STARTED CLIMBING BACK UP FROM 10,000 FEET. MY SECOND ELEMENT STAYED ABOUT 3,000 FEET OVER ME DURING THE ENGAGEMENT AND ANOTHER FLIGHT STAYED AT 20,000 FEET. MY WING MAN AND THE REST OF THE FLIGHT PROVIDED PROTECTION DURING THE WHOLE ENGAGEMENT.

I WAS LEADING YELLOW FLIGHT AND WAS WEAVING THE FLIGHT WITH BLUE FLIGHT ABOUT 20 MILES SOUTH OF ROUEN AT 14,000 FT. ABOUT 1530. WE WERE COVERING B24s. SEVEN S.E. E/A WENT OVER US HEADING SOUTHEAST. WE FOLLOWED ABOUT 10 MILES AND AS OVER US HEADING SOUTHEAST. WE FOLLOWED ABOUT 10 MILES AND AS WE WERE NOT GAINING WE TURNED BACK TO THE BOMBERS. ON OUR SECOND WEAVE AS WE WERE CROSSING EACH OTHER WE WERE BOUNCED BY 7 ME 109s WHICH APPEARED TO HAVE CLIPPED TIPS BUT POSSIBLY NO TAIL STRUTS AS IN THE ME 109 E. I TURNED INTO THEM TO THE RIGHT. YELLOW 4 WAS HIT, LOST AN ENGINE AND WINT TO THE DECK. YELLOW 3 YELLED THAT HE HAD TWO ON HIS TAIL. I THREW FLAPS DOWN, DROPPED MY TANKS AND BROKE LEFT. ONE OF THE 109s PEELED OFF BUT THE OTHER STAYED ON YELLOW 3'S TAIL. I TURNED INSIDE HIM AND AT 300 YDS. AND AN ANGLE OF 40 DEG. I OPENED FIRE. I SAW HITS ON THE LEFT SIDE OF THE FUSELAGE AND A PUFF OF SMOKE. THE 109 HALF ROLLED AND WENT SRTAIGHT DOWN. I LROKE OFF TO HELP YELLOW 3 WHO HAD A SMOKING RIGHT ENGINE. CLAIM: 1 ME 109 D.MAGED

I. I was leading blue flight and we were rejoining the bombers near Koblenz at 1135 after an unsuccessful bounce when I saw a FW 190 on the tail box of bombers. I gave chase and came up on him at 16,000 feet from the rear. From 250 yards and an angle off of 50, indicating 275, I opened fire and closed to 75 yards. I saw many hits, an explosion and smoke - pieces flew off. The FW 190 fell off into a spin, still burning. He spun down, still burning and was still spinning when he went into the overcast at 4,000 feet.

On way home about 1230 E. of Lille while covering crippled bombers I saw two FW 190s on a bomber. Gave chase and after 15 miles drew up on the two ship flight. I headed for the wingman

15 miles drew up on the two ship flight. I headed for the wingman indicating 375 at 2,000 feet and at 200 yards. I opened fire - angle off 8° - saw hits, an explosion, pieces and smoke - broke off at 75 yards. My wingman saw plane spin down in flames. Turned to right and drew up behind leader and from 200 yards - angle off 10° I fired and closed to 75 yards. Saw hits and explosion, pieces flew off. W 190 fell off to right. Wingman saw him falling down in flames. ctack was in 20 mile area hole in overcast. Claim: 3 FW 190s DESTROYED.

We were flying Red 1 (Capt. Graham and Red 2 (1t. Bench) and saw 2 Me 110s below us circling and climbing to get to the rear of the bombers. We were at 20,000 feet. The Me 110s were at 14,000 to 15,000 feet. Red flight went down and white flight covered. Approached from dead astern indicating 300 mph and both Red 1 and Red 2 opened fire on right at 250 to 300 yards and dlosed to loo yards each firing 4 short bursts. Right engine blew up and strikes completely covered area between both engines. strikes completely covered area between both engines. Left engine then went out and entire tail assembly fell off. Plane spun down on fire.

Flight swung left on to second Me 110 who was taking skidding, yawing and turning evasive action. Red 1 and Red 2 again both opened fire at 250 yards about 200 off E/A broke sharply to the left and pulled away. We caught up and followed his evasive action then opened fire from astern at 400 yards each firing a long burst. Strikes were observed and from under both engines white and black smoke poured out. E/A stopped all evasive action and fell off to the left in a gentle then steep dive as if out of control and still smoking. Element leader was covering from half way down and called Red leader to break off combat and return. Broke off at about 10,000 feet and climbed back to 20,000 and rejoined the bombers. The element leader saw the second plane crash and explode. Claim: 2 Me 110s Destroyed - Shared.

Rei Leader at 20,000 feet called in 2 Me 110s taking off from an airport. Red flight went down and when the E/A were 300 to 500 feet above the ground the flight was closing fast. One Me 110 broke to the lift and Red Leader and Red 2 followed it. The E/A was travelling about 200 mph and Red Leader about 400 mph and overshot after a short burst.

Red Leader made an effective gunnery pattern with

combat flaps firing on each pass from 30° and closing to dead

astern. He made at least six passes in this manner firing from

30° to dead astern and 300 yards to less than 100 yards. The E/A

was indicating about 100 mph and Red Leader about 150 mph with

combat flaps. On several passes Red 2 also fired from 300 yards

and about 30° and strikes were concentrated mainly on the right

wing, wing root, right on the and right side of the fuselage. The wing, wing root, right en ine and right side of the fuselage. The E/A crash landed in the snow and Red Leader made a 360 and returned to strafe the plane. While strafing it, he hit the ground, pulled up as if into a right hand barrel roll and while on his back his nose dropped and he crashed at about a 600 angle.
